*(dated within 6 months of enrollment)*
  
- Emergency Contact information  
*(Minimum of two (2) emergency contacts. All Fort Irwin base schools: If you have just arrived, you may use your unit, 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt, FRG Coordinator or someone in your chain of command. Do not list yourself or your spouse as an emergency contact. Parents are always called first. Emergency contacts are called only if we are unable to reach the parents.)*

### **Immunization Requirements**

Every pupil 17 years of age or younger is required by law to be fully immunized against Polio, Diphtheria, Pertussis/Whooping Cough, Tetanus, Measles, Mumps and Rubella, and Hepatitis B. Chicken pox vaccine is required for kindergarten entry or for anyone coming from out of the State of California. The parent/guardian has the right to sign an affidavit or personal belief exempting his/her child from immunization requirements. (Education Code 49043, 48216, 489808)

GUIDE TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE CALIFORNIA SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION LAW FOR GRADES K-12

REFERENCE: Health and Safety Code, Division 105, Part 2, Chapter 1, Section 120325-120380; California Code of Regulations, Title 17, Division 1, Chapter 4, Subchapter 8, Sections 6000-6075

IMMUNIZATION: To enter or transfer into public and private elementary and secondary schools (grades kindergarten through 12), children under age 18 years must have immunizations as outlined below.

### **Students Entering Kindergarten**

**Diphtheria, Pertussis, and Tetanus (DPT)** Five (5) doses

**Polio** Four (4) doses

**Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR)** Two (2) doses

**Hepatitis B** Three (3) doses

**Varicella (chickenpox)** One (1) dose

### **Students Entering Grade Seven**

**Tetanus, reduced Diphtheria, and acellular Pertussis (Tdap)** One (1) dose on or after 7<sup>th</sup> birthday

**Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR)** Two (2) doses

**Varicella (chickenpox)** Two (2) doses for ages 13-17 years applies to transfer students who were not admitted to a California school before July 1, 2001

### **Transportation to School**

The school district will provide transportation for students under provisions of state law and regulations. Students who reside beyond the maximum walking distance as defined below shall be eligible for transportation service to the school for their attendance area.

Maximum walking distance to a school or bus stop are:

- Grades K-3: three-fourths mile
- Grade 4-8: one mile
- Grade 9-12: two miles
